In some of the strongest language in Scripture, the readings today clearly describe the role of those who follow Jesus, to be dupes, complicit in their oppression; outcasts, out of sync with their time and society, with bodies marked for living sacrifice. And no prophet, no epistle was as unequivocal in this portrayal as Jesus, who made plain that glory comes only through the cross. The social and religious complacency that Jesus decried is no less a factor for Christians now. Jesus' passionate message for his disciples rings true for us: Complacency in the face of suffering is an outrage. Nothing less than full commitment to love of God and love of each other will do, and status-quo systems of violence and discrimination may not be ignored by those who claim to follow Christ. *Read Open Wide Our Hearts, the US Conference of Catholic pastoral letter against racism (http://www.usccb.org/issues-and-aaction/human-life-anddignity/racism/upload/open-wide-our-hearts.pdf). *Discerns whether you are conforming to systems of injustice or working to transform them and yourself.

If you or someone you know has been abused by a cleric, employee, or volunteer of any archdiocesan parish, school, or agency – regardless of when the abuse may have occurred – call the archdiocesan confidential report line at 913.647.3051 or the Victim Care Advocate at 913.298.9244, after calling local law enforcement. You can also make a report using the online form at www.archkck.org/reportabuse. The Archdiocese places the protection of children as its priority. The archdiocese respects the sincere concerns of all individuals who report misconduct and is committed to conducting thorough investigations of all allegations.

The Archdiocese has a comprehensive resource for end-of-life planning titled "Catholic Guide For End-Of-Life and Establishing of Advance Directives." The purpose of the guide is to assist the faithful in making wise decisions in accordance with the teachings of our faith about complex treatments in grave illness or as life's end approaches.
