the call sounded like, what it might have felt like to hear Jesus' voice calling them.

\*Imagine yourself in the story of the call of the first disciples. There were many traveling preachers at the time of Jesus. What made this one stand out? Was it Jesus' words, "fishers of men," to Andrew and Peter? Was it something in Jesus' tone or about the way he looked? Had they heard of this Jesus? \*Lectio divina is a way of praying with Scripture. Read the Gospel twice. On the second time, pay attention to the words that stand out to you. Repeat those words and sit with them. \*When we pray with this particular Scripture, we see how we might see more clearly our own call. God is always calling to us, always waiting for us to respond in love. Discuss with a close friend how you see God calling you.
